

Chestnut

Hat



Size: Female

Yarn: Approx. 40 g HS Angel and approx. 20 g HS Silk Mohair

Needle size: Approx. 3,5
Gauge: Approx. 20/10

Fading:

If you want to use leftover yarn to create fade, do as follows: Start with the lighter yarn. Knit until round 7. Change one strand of yarn to a slightly darker one. Knit until round 1 again, change the other strand to slightly darker. Continue like this and switch to a slightly darker strand of yarn on rounds 1 and 7.

Abbrieviations:

SSK = slip, slip, knit twisted together

K2tog = knit 2 together

Pattern:

Cast on 108 stitches with 1 strand of HS Angel and 1 strand of HS silk mohair on needle size 3.5 mm. Try on to check your size. If necessary, adjust your needle size, or cast on 6 stitches or more. Knit 3 rounds of stockinette to create a small rolling edge on the brim of your hat. Work pattern according to chart 1 until you have 10 rows of chestnuts or until your work measures approx. 19 cm. Stop at desired length and after round 12. Then knit chart 2 once.

Symbol descriptions:

= Knit

= Left leaning decrease (SSK)

 \angle = k2tog

• = Purl

▼ = k1, yo, k1 into the same stitch = 3 sts

♥ = k1, yo, k1, yo, k1 into the same stitch = 5 sts

<u>↑</u> = sl 1 sts, k2tog, p1sso

= OBS!

On round 7 chart 2 **purl** 3 stitches together instead of ...




In the crowning of the hat, you decrease stitches by knitting 3 stitches in the chestnuts instead of 5. In addition, you bind off 3 stitches by purling 3 together on round 19. Finally, you knit 1 and purl 1 for 3 rounds. Break yarn and pull through remaining stitches. Fasten loose ends.
